The Presbyterian Fellowship

The Presbyterian Fellowship is an association of members, adherents and supporters of the Presbyterian Church who are seeking to maintain the worship, doctrines and practices of the Church as they have been since the Basis of Union was adopted in 1901.

The Fellowship is not opposed to change but is opposed to a narrowing and restricting of those tenets of belief and practice for which the Church has always been well-known and respected.

The Aims of the Fellowship (as per its constitution) are set out in the central panel and membership is open to anyone who in all good conscience can agree with them.

Membership of the Fellowship also includes a subscription to the "Presbyterian Review" in which the Fellowship will advertise its activities and supply information.

The Fellowship has been incorporated and any donations will be gratefully received. They will always be applied according to the aims of the Presbyterian Fellowship.

Note: The Presbyterian Fellowship has no connection with the organization operating in Victorian churches that refers to itself as "The Fellowship"

The Aims of the Fellowship are as follows:

- To provide Christian love and support for all its members
- To assist members in the practice of a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ
- To do all in the power of its members to work for the salvation of all mankind
- To engage in the work of Christ's Church
- To use the reformed doctrines as instruments in proclaiming the Gospel and building up the people of God, and not as ends in themselves
- To support the members of the Fellowship who belong to the Presbyterian Church of Australia in the task of maintaining the church founded upon the Basis of Union 1901
- To resist changes by the courts of the Church which alter the Declaratory Statement and thereby take away the protection of the rights of the members of the Church
- To work for the removal of unnecessary and unscriptural limitation on ministry, and in particular the prevention or women being ministers and elders
- To promote freedom of speech as absolutely necessary for that discipline which is the mark of a true church
- To hold funds for the proper discharge of its work
